
Be Safe While You Hike


As you begin your journey, please observe these safety tips:

Welcome to the Gardner Center

Formerly the home of the U.S. Forest Service's Forestry Sciences Laboratory, the Gardner Center is one of many historical sites that still exist in Mercer County. The research facility was constructed in the early 1960's and remained in operation until 2016.

After the Mercer County Commission acquired the property in 2020, it was renamed "The Gardner Center" and became a multi-purpose facility that is now the home of various non-profit agencies, public hiking trails, horseshoe pits, and a disc golf course.

Book an Event

If you are searching for venue to host a meeting or event, give us a call. The Gardner Center has a spacious auditorium with lots of seating capacity, and a library that will suit your conference needs. The Gardner Center charges \$50/day for the library and \$100/day for the auditorium. Our staff will assist you in setting up for your event.
